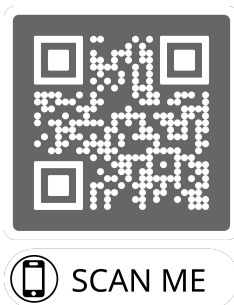
Coaches
